### Unions need a lot of damage control

You might remember about 10 years ago, medical malpractice reform was all the rage, primarily led by local doctors who said they were going broke.

Those of us who don't pay medical malpractice insurance initially were skeptical: Does this mean you have to downsize from a Jaguar to a Mercedes. Or, God forbid, a domestic car?

The problem was that in the initial stages of the discussion, doctors were not very good at explaining just how bad the situation was and why they were going broke, if not being forced out of practice entirely.

It turned out medical malpractice insurance premiums were rising faster than globally warmed oceans because the dwindling number of insurance companies offering such coverage was spooked into settling claims rather than taking a gamble in front of a "jackpot jury."

Although some still scoffed, physicians— especially the specialists such as obstetricians and neurologists—did, indeed, move to states where premiums were lower. Or they went out of business, leaving for a while a noticeable gap in local and regional medical offerings.

### Standard mileage rates

Gas prices may be down, but business mileage rates—how much you can deduct if you use a car for business purposes—are up for 2015.



The Internal Revenue Service announced standard mileage rates for 2015 today for taxpayers to use in calculating the

deductible costs of using a car for business, charitable, medical or moving purposes. (Yes, driving to the doctor or the food pantry can be deductible.)

In Notice 2014-79, the IRS lists the standard mileage rates, effective as of Jan. 1, 2015:

- ◆ Business use: 57.5 cents a mile
- ◆ Charitable use: 14 cents a mile
- ◆ Medical use: 23 cents a mile
- ◆ Moving use: 23 cents a mile

The business use rates are up from 56 cents a mile in 2014. The medical use and moving rates are down from 23.5 cents a mile in 2014. The charity use rate stays the same at 14 cents a mile. The rate for charitable miles driven has been fixed at 14 cents a mile since 1997, but the other rates are adjusted each year.



### CAWGC purchases building next door

The CAWGC recently purchased the building next door to our current building. The building had set empty for quite some time and shares a parking lot with the CAWGC. The owner agreed to sell it to the association for a very reasonable price.

The building is now rented to Community Care Systems which had been in the

old Weber Dairy building in Joliet for over 20 years and is a company that provides non medical in-home services to those in need of assistance.

### TRMA Safety Center

The next time you visit the TRMA Safety Center you will notice several changes. These enhancements were completed in January to better serve the needs of the manufacturers and contractors utilizing the training center. Here is a summary of the improvements:

- ◆ The total floor space at the training center was increased by 1/3. The size of the computer room was doubled. Phase 1 increased the number of computer stations from 46 to 66 and additional space is available to add 20 more computers in the future. This change allows students to come in anytime from 6:30 am to 1:00 pm on weekdays to take a CBT course. This schedule might be modified during turnaround times.

Plans are underway to add general safety CBT courses to our training offerings. The first course that has been added is Bloodborne Pathogens. We encourage our members to contact TRMA if they have a particular subject matter they would like to see added to our training offerings.

TRMA can also assist Contractor companies with their onboard training of their workers.

- ◆ A 1,250 square foot area was added for hands-on training. Hands-on Fall Protection and Scaffold User training that began in February.
- ◆ The training check-in area was expanded to improve traffic flow and enhance security of personal information. Three check-in stations will be available instead of two. This will expedite check-in during turnarounds and major projects. The new check-in stations opened.

## Unions *(continued from page 1)*

As that issue smolders in the undercurrents of insurance reform, there is another group that has done a lousy job of defending what is rightfully theirs:

Unions.

Let me ask you something: You ask me to hold some money for you, an increasing amount over the years. Then you learn I have spent much of it to pay my own bills. Who is the bad guy here? Well, if you're the unions, and the state— or some municipalities - spent a good chunk of your money without your permission, it's obviously the unions.

With this type of logic, it's no wonder we wound up fighting Iraq after 9/11.

The problem for the union—or others who have pensions—is that even before the recession, there were a growing trend of businesses not offering pensions. In fact, the faster they could get rid of you, the better. The recession exacerbated that to the point where more people than in a long time were without work, let alone a pension.

So what you have had in the past several years is a growing number of people who want to retire, but the money is not there, and an equally growing number of people who don't feel sorry for them a bit. In fact, sometimes, they blame the whole lack of business coming back on them.

Wisconsin Governor Scott Walker used that public sentiment as a mandate to severely reduce the power of unions in the state. He survived challenges, including a recall vote and now

Illinois Governor Bruce Rauner is heading down the same path.

Now would be a good time for unions to remind the general public they are the victims here; Not the ones who took the money. The state took their money. Money guaranteed in contracts.

It also would be a good time for unions to acknowledge economic times have changed. We cannot afford the same things we did 10 years ago. The middle Class is disappearing. Wages and benefits agreed to in future contracts can't be far out of line with what taxpayers can pay. Businesses are surviving with fewer employees and by offering no benefits, unless they are ordered to.

Too often during the past 10 years or so, unions have chosen to fight for increasingly higher wages and benefits, only to see the management trim hundreds of jobs they can no longer afford.

During tough times, there needs to be a spirit of compromise, on both sides. There needs to be management offering what they can as a fair wage to allow a person to support a family, keep food on the table, a roof over their heads and help with coverage in case of, or to prevent, illness.

That, in turn, will help employees to be able to afford the higher prices other businesses likely will have to charge to offset said fair wages and benefits.

I was proud to be a union member and president of a union that represented nearly 600 newspaper people. I was proud when we stood our ground and got what we felt we needed.

I was less proud when I was outvoted and had to do things because they were in the best interest of the union, and not the employees and their customers.

I hope it's not too late for unions and the state to work out their issues. But considering Governor Rauner's volley so far, it looks like it might be.

The CAWGC continues to stock the planroom with projects throughout the county for members to use. Last year we had 40% more plans in our planroom than the previous year. We hope to continue to be a valuable resource for your company.

We offer both hard copies of plans as well as our on-line planroom. Members have all been assigned codes to get in the on-line planroom at their convenience. As an added measure to keep our members informed we send out an e-mail each Friday outlining all the projects available. If you have any problems with your codes or questions on how to navigate the on-line planroom, give the staff a call and they will be happy to assist you.

This year we hope to redesign our

website which will include updating the way you are able to view and download plans. Members will be able to access more plans via our website so keep checking in.

Each month we also have a project leads section on our website which is available to **members only**. There are many new projects in discussion for the area including a new IKEA Distribution Center and a new Pilot Travel Center both at the corner of Route 53 and Laraway Road in Joliet. If the IKEA gets the approvals they need they could start construction in the fall. The Pilot has already received approval from the Plan Commission and they hope to start construction as soon as possible. Cresco Labs was awarded a license from the



state to operate a medical marijuana growing facility in the Illinois State Police District 5.

They plan to build their facility on CenterPoint way in Joliet. Saddle Creek Logistics has been tossing up the idea of moving from their Elwood location to a 1 million square foot location in the CenterPoint Intermodal Center Industrial Park in Joliet.

Many projects large and small are coming to the area and we here at CAWGC will be working hard to make sure we get as many plans as possible in our planroom.

Also, don't forget about our KIP plan copier available for our members to print out plans we may have in our planroom or some of your own. We only charge for the cost of the paper and members are billed on a monthly basis. Stop in anytime Monday through Friday 8:30am to 4:30pm. CAWGC Chairman.




First place prize will be a \$3000 travel voucher toward the destination of your
